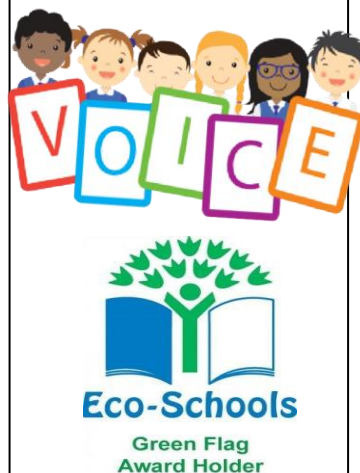


PUPIL VOICE

Mrs Foy is our Learning Support Coordinator. Targets this year include embedding inclusive, dyslexia-friendly practices across the school, ensuring pupils with dyslexia are supported effectively. We also plan to reduce the percentage of children underachieving in Literacy and to embed the new Graduated Response Framework that provides staff with support and guidance for children facing difficulties.



MATHEMATICS

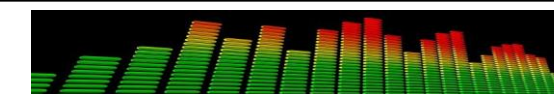
Along with achieving our data targets the overall objective is to raise standards in all areas of Mathematics through high quality teaching and learning. Mathematics will be introduced to all year groups and a structured audit of 'processes' will be completed across all year groups, involving lesson observations, constructive feedback and areas for development.



A School Development Plan is a strategic plan for improvement. It brings together the school's priorities, the main measures it will take to raise standards, the resources dedicated to these and the key outcomes and targets it intends to achieve. I.C.T.

Digital Leaders include Year 5, 6 and 7. These children are responsible for helping others in all areas of ICT. All year groups will include a focus from the CCEA Digital Skills for Work and Life framework. Children will also improve skills in using Clicker, Adobe Express and Coding.



BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Our Board of Governors meet at least once every term with sub-committees often meeting more regularly. The board has been reconstituted, and we welcome our new members. The main areas of responsibility are for Staff Appointments, Admissions, School Development Planning, Budget and many other areas of school life. LEARNING SUPPORT CLASS

Our Learning Support Class officially opened in September 2023. Targets for this year include successful administration of the Wellcomm assessment, implementation of the Boardmaker programme, establishing a cluster meeting with other support classes within Fermanagh who will meet regularly to share experiences and offer support and guidance, an increase in the adult to pupil ratio within the Learning Support Class and more integration with the Year 1, 2 and 3 classes.



LITERACY:

Reading and Handwriting

Mrs Foy has worked with all the teachers in producing an action plan that includes a focus on reading and handwriting. Observations of lessons and written work as evidence will be used to embed good practices. Targeted children in Years 3 - 7 will receive extra Literacy support from school staff. Reading Eggs and Amira ICT programmes will be used to help improve children's Literacy skills.



Nursery

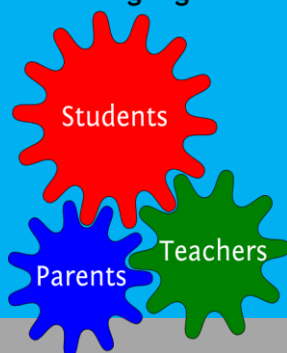
Our Nursery Unit will continue to embed activities to support the development of children's good mental health, emotional wellbeing and resilience. Children will be able to confidently express their feelings and use strategies to cope with negative feelings. A 'Calm Corner' will be created to help support children's emotional needs. Nursery will also participate in the Aspire Peace Plus shared education programme with St Ronan's Lisnaskea developing positive relationships and building friendships.

CHILD PROTECTION
